The 21st annual **Computers, Freedom, & Privacy (CFP)** is accepting proposals for this year's conference, which will take place on **June 14-16, 2011**. The theme for the 2011 conference is **"The Future is Now."**

This year's call for proposals we will focus on the present state of technology and its impact on **human rights** struggles around the world.
